FOREWORD

In 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic hit the entire world. France Volontaires quickly took concrete steps in contributing to limiting the spread of the virus. The deployment of volunteers was put on hold until further notice, all the Espaces Volontariats closed in mid – March, and a lot of activities were cancelled or postponed including the French Volunteering Day – a key annual event celebrated within the Espaces Volontariats network.

Activities did not cease, however, as the team used teleworking for 7 months for Ghana. The organisations of International Solidarity adapted and many worked to contribute to the response to the crisis, sometimes adjusting their activities with the goal of responding to the needs of the vulnerable for instance (sensitisation, distribution of sanitary materials...).

Monitoring of volunteers was done with the support of France Volontaires' partners, the Cultural and Cooperation Department of the French Embassy and Alliance Française of Accra mostly through two WhatsApp groups for the French volunteers in Ghana and for the Ghanaian volunteers in France. As a result, 4 French volunteers (1 VSI and 3 Service Civique) were able to successfully return to France and 5 Ghanaian volunteers whose missions ended during the pandemic (flights cancelled, host institutions closed) were assisted in facilitating their return to Ghana.

With the efforts of the French Embassy in Ghana, Alliance Française of Accra, the host institutions in France and France Volontaires Ghana, they were able to join repatriation flights and observe their obligatory quarantine on their arrival before joining their families.

In mid-October, the Espace Volontariats of Ghana team was able to return to the office without opening to the general public and there was the progressive deployment of volunteers from autumn.

In Ghana, from the month of March, different measures were put in place by authorities to reduce the spread of the virus therefore a lockdown was imposed till April, both airports and land borders were closed (until September for the airport) as well as schools and a ban on all social gatherings.

Despite this challenging situation, France Volontaires Ghana has been able to put in place, with the support of the French Embassy and Alliance Française of Accra, several actions aimed at developing, enhancing and promoting French volunteerism in Ghana.

It is time to appreciate the Ghanaian authorities for the facilities they offer France Volontaires in relation to the development and implantation of French volunteerism in Ghana.

We are equally grateful to her Excellency, the Ambassador of France to Ghana and the entire team of the Cultural and Cooperation Department for their support and constant assistance to France Volontaires.

France Volontaires is the French platform of International Volunteering of Exchange and Solidarity (VIES). Created in 2009 as an association, France Volontaires is the fruit of a shared construction between public and associative stakeholders in the field of international solidarity. As an implementing agency of the French Ministry of Europe and

Foreign Affairs, it brings together the State, local and regional authorities and associations around a mission of general interest: the development and promotion of international volunteer engagements and solidarity. It is based on a presence in France (mainland and overseas) and on a network of Espaces Volontariats in Africa, Asia and Latin America.

CONSULTATION AND ADVOCACY

France Volontaires organises dialogues between the actors of volunteerism and participates in the definition and implementation of public policies and multi-stakeholder initiatives in the field of international solidarity commitment.

INFORMATION AND ORIENTATION

France Volontaires makes known to many (public institutions, associations, the general public...) the different forms of French and European international volunteerism (VSI, Service Civique engagement, SVE...) through different means: information and orientation of the public, publications, digital tools, participation in various events.

VALORISATION

France Volontaires promotes the recognition and the valorisation of volunteerism and all forms of international solidarity engagements, including their consideration in the volunteer's career path.

EXPERIMENTATION

France Volontaires analyses the dynamics of volunteerism and implements specific programmes in a process of experimentation and capitalisation. Through its international network, the platform provides support to national volunteering schemes and reciprocity programmes (hosting international volunteers in France).

SUPPORT AND NETWORKING

France Volontaires offers training expertise and participates in capacity building for its members and partners in France and abroad. Its Espace Volontariats are levers for action, support and networking for all volunteer actors in the countries where they are based, in order to secure the commitment process and multiply its effects.

Our vision of volunteerism

International solidarity commitment is a powerful cross-sectional response to the challenges of our society and our world. It is evolving into a global-volunteering perspective: accessible to all, locally and internationally, throughout life. It is based on human relataions, cultural exchanges, partnerships and the principle of reciprocity. It is part of a civic and professional process of acquiring knowledge: new soft skills and know-how. By its universal character, it contributes to the challenges related to human and sustainable development and the strengthening of civil societies. It contributes to the emergence of inclusive, supportive societies open to the world.

The international network

France Volontaires relies on a network of Espace Volontariats in Africa, the Middle East, Latin-America/Carribbean and Asia. As resource centres, they inform, orient, guide and promote networks between the various actors of international volunteerism (candidates, volunteers, sending structures, public authorities...). The Espaces Volontariats teams equally organise actions aimed at promoting the different forms of volunteerism and their contributions, as well as to reinforce the capacity of stakeholders and to better understand socio-cultural contexts of the areas of intervention. France Volontaires also has territorial offices in Ivry-sur- Seine, Lille, Nantes, Marseille, Réunion Island and New Caledonia.

The Espace Volontariats of Ghana, first Espace Volontariats in an Anglophone country in the sub-region, is strategically located within the premises of Alliance Française of Accra.





Communication has been one of the priorities in order to, among other things, increase France Volontaires' visibility in Ghana, strengthen long-standing partnerships and establish new ones, with the aim of establishing the organisation as a key player in the field of volunteerism in Ghana.








Volunteer Guide to Ghana

ACTIVITIES OF THE EV

New team

The new Espace Volontariats of Ghana team came together at the end of February in Espace Volontariats of Togo for a week of immersion with its members, including the National Representative of Ghana and Togo - Moussa Bah - who is based in Togo, before getting settled in Ghana.

Now, therefore, the team is made up of 2 people whose mission is to promote and develop French volunteerism in Ghana and reciprocal volunteerism between Ghana and France. Belinda, former Ghanaian VIR in France, is in charge of supporting the development of volunteerism, and Fanny, French VSI, is in charge of communication and partnership relations.

Supported by the National Representative, they host, virtually and physically, all the actors of volunteerism (volunteers, applicants, sending and host institutions...) by informing, orienting and guiding them.



Study

A prospective study on the dynamics of national and international volunteerism and on the opportunities for the development of French volunteerism in Ghana is being carried out by the communication and partnership relations officer. At the end of the year, the terms of reference were drafted, as well as the questionnaires intended for the various actors targeted in this study.

EU AID VOLUNTEERS PROJECTS

FORESTS project

The FORESTS project is an EU-funded project piloted by France Volontaires in collaboration with ESI LABS! (Letonian organisation), SRD (Vietnamese organisation), and national representations of France Volontaires in Congo, Guinea, Ghana, Cameroon and Vietnam – the 5 countries in the project. It aims at the preservation of forest ecosystems and on reducing the vulnerability of the local people concerned by focusing on reinforcing the resilence capacity of the communities affected. Launched in December 2019, this project will bring on board 27 European volunteers who will be deployed across the 5 countries, with 3 coming to Ghana.

In Ghana, the volunteers will work directly with a local organisation, EcoCare Ghana, a Non-Governmental Organisation based on the rights of the communities and forests and how they are linked to development, climate change, conservation of the fauna and flora, and agriculture principally.

In 2020, the first phase of the project was rolled out. For France Volontaires Ghana, this translated into series of team meetings, exchanges with EcoCare, the selection of 3 volunteers through interviews conducted with ESI LABS!, and the first consortium meeting in 4 different virtual sessions on specific thematic areas that brought together all the partners and actors concerned.



Participation in an EU call for projects

France Volontaires Ghana participated in a multi-stakeholder call for projects which equally involved the representations of France Volontaires in Togo, in Senegal and in Guinea. The proposal of the project which was named PLANET, was submitted in July. In Ghana, a local association was identified as the structure for the project: the association Ghana Developing Communities Association (GDCA), which works in different fields including education, food security, adaptation to climate change, strengthening civil society and ensuring participation in local governance.





However, the project could not be financed due to the COVID-19 pandemic and travel restrictions and hence could not be implemented.

AFRICA2020 SEASON

The Africa2020 Season is a panafrican and multidisciplinary project centred on innovation in the arts, sciences, technology, the economy and entrepreneurship, organised and implemented by Institut Français with support from the Minsitry of Europe and Foreign Affairs, the Ministry of Culture, the Ministry of Youth and National Education, the Ministry of Sports, in partnership with Agence Française de Développement. Dedicated to the 54 African States and built around the great challenges of the 21st Century, this Season presents the viewpoint of the civil society of the African Continent and its recent diapora, will lean towards mobility, honour women in all sectors of activity and will target the youth with the aim of global emancipation across a sustainable engagement built around the values of citizenship. It will take place across the whole of France (metropolis and overseas territories) from December 2020 to July 2021.

Within the context of this project, 11 young Africans from 11 different countries will have the opportunity of carrying out an International Volunteering of Reciprocity mission in France with the status of Service Civique. Ghana is part of these countries, hence, Afua, a young Ghanaian, was selected to carry out a mission with La Condition Publique, a structure based in Roubaix, from January and for 7 months.

Beforehand, the Espace Volontariats of Ghana team met one of the members of the Ghanaian structure Exit Frame, (one of the three actors with France Volontaires and La Condition Publique involved in setting up Afua's mission) who, after reviewing the profile of candidates, proposed candidates who met the required criteria. Following this, interviews were conducted for 3 selected candidates and an interview with the chosen candidate and the host structure. There was equally a debriefing session with all the candidates to offer them pieces of advice and tips for future opportunities. The volunteer received administrative support and was prepared before her departure (on interculturality, helpful tips...). At the same time, the team had exchanges with the coordinator of the volunteer programme in order to discuss the needs of the volunteer and to better prepare for her arrival.



MISSION OF THE NATIONAL REPRESENTATIVE OF FRANCE VOLONTAIRES GHANA

Despite the peculiar year we are in, the National Representative of France Volontaires Ghana, Moussa Bah, was able to carry out a mission to Ghana all the same with a busy schedule at the Espace Volontariats. Discover more below!

Review with the third cohort of Volunteers of International Reciprocity

On the 29th of October, the France Volontaires Ghana team hosted Easteria Esinam Edor and Maud Naa Adaku Tagoe, 2 of the 5 Ghanaian volunteers who carried out international volunteer missions in France with the Service Civique scheme in 2019-2020.

The goal of this meet up was to bring together all the actors that made this cohort possible, to exchange in person, to review and to capitalise on the experiences of the volunteers in order to ensure that this scheme remains beneficial and well suited to them. Afua, young Ghanaian selected for a Service Civique mission in France, was present, equally to better understand the scheme and to anticipate her future experience.





Invitation for an event

A part of the France Volontaires Ghana team was honoured to the Gold Award Ceremony 2020 organised by the Head of States Award Scheme (HoSA) on 30th October. This ceremony, which was graced by the President of Ghana Nana Akuffo-Addo, was an event to award young Ghanaians in the project.

MISSION OF THE NATIONAL REPRESENTATIVE OF FRANCE VOLONTAIRES GHANA

Strategic Policy Board

On the 30th of October, the France Volontaires Ghana team participated in the annual Strategic Policy Board meeting at the Residence of the Embassy of France, which brings together the network of actors of the French cooperation in Ghana, with the aim to validate and re-examine periodically the action plan of the French network in Ghana and to fix its goals.

In relation to France Volontaires, Moussa Bah raised many issues including the Cooperation Agreement on the promotion of volunteerism and the exchange of volunteers and language assistants, the contribution of France Volontaires and other actors in the volunteerism sector in Ghana to the inclusion of volunteerism in the Voluntary National Review that Ghana presented at the High-level Political Forum in 2019, the 2019 French Volunteer Day, the certification of the Espace Volontariats of Ghana by the Directorate General for Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations of the European Commission of the EU, which allowed it to apply for the FORESTS project, the participation of France Volontaires in another call for projects of the European Union, the deployment of a young Ghanaian woman in France for a volunteer mission the framework Africa2020 in of the Season...



FACE-TO-FACE MEETINGS

The France Volontaires Ghana team met with 14 partners in 2020.

National Service Scheme

The Espace Volontariats of Ghana team met with the Directorate of the General Administration of National Service Scheme (NSS), a programme by the Ghanaian government to develop national service - a compulsory programme for young Ghanaians graduating from a higher education institution to support the development of priority public and private sectors in Ghana. Long-time partners, the two institutions were able to discuss together possible avenues for collaboration with regard to their current dynamics.



COVOG

COVOG (Coalition of Voluntary Organisations in Ghana), a major partner of France Volontaires, received the Espace Volontariats of Ghana team at their premises. Reciprocity, advocacy, development of the French language in Ghana were some of the issues raised.

Kongo Community Development Association

The Espace Volontariats of Ghana team received Kingsley Mort, the founder of Kongo Community Development Association, at the office. This organisation works primarily with widows and orphans in the Upper East Region and often hosts volunteers.





VOLU

VOLU (Voluntary Workcamps Association of Ghana) is one of the oldest organisations in the volunteerism sector in Ghana and, more precisely, in work camps. A meeting was organised at the Espace Volontariats of Ghana in order for the two organisations to introduce themselves and to find points of synergy.

FACE-TO-FACE MEETINGS

Alliance Française of Kumasi

The Officer in Charge of Volunteering Development of France Volontaires Ghana, met with Madame Sophie Erlich, the director of Alliance Française of Kumasi. Together, they discussed common opportunities possible after the pandemic.





Exit Frame

The Officer in Charge of Volunteering Development of France Volontaires Ghana had a discussion with Dr. Akoi-Jackson, a lecturer at the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST) and a member of the artist collective Exit Frame, which led to a collaboration in the context of Africa2020 Season.

Ecole Thérèse Internationale

The Espace Volontariats of Ghana team paid a courtesy call on Madame Theodora Wood, the director of the English-French bligual school école Thérèse Internationale, to discuss their needs and the different volunteering schemes that could respond to these needs.





ARUDMO

The Espace Volontariats of Ghana team had a meeting with Mr. David Atieku and Madam Ivy Florence Damalie of the NGO ARUDMO (African Rural Development Movement) which has been in contact with France Volontaires Ghana since its beginning. It was an opportunity for the two organisations to present their respective activities and their expectations in the short term.

REMOTE MEETINGS

HoSA



The Head of State Award Scheme (HoSA) is a programme that engages young Ghanaians between the ages of 14 and 24 with the aim of encouraging them to become involved as citizens and to develop their skills through various actions. A call was organised for the new team of Espace Volontariats of Ghana to introduce themselves, to review the respective activities of the two structures and to discuss their projects set up to fight against the COVID-19 pandemic.

United Way Ghana



The Espace Volontariats of Ghana team made contact with United Way Ghana, an organisation that pushes for the interests of local communities in three main areas – education, health and revenue creation - in order to present their respective organisations and their contribution to the fight against the pandemic.

Ghana Girl Guides association



The Ghana Girl Guides association, which aims to assist girls to identify and develop their potential through different ways, was contacted by the Espace Volontariats of Ghana team to know more about their general activities and in line with the fight against the COVID-19.

KOICA KOICA GHANA OFFICE

The Espace Volontariats of Ghana team made contact with KOICA (Korea International Cooperation Agency). Together, the two organisations discussed their respective ways of developing volunteerism of their countries in Ghana, and KOICA presented some actions they carried out in the fight against the pandemic.


Pedald Ltd




Area(s) of intervention: Locminé and Saint-Thuriau (Morbihan)
